
DUDE PERFECT: A VERY LONG SHOT

WATER WARS

PORCELAIN WAR

Defiantly finding beauty amid destruction, they show that although it's easy to make people afraid, it's hard to destroy their passion for living.



As an originator of Native community engagement she has established herself as a vital cultural and community resource for Native-content projects produced by the networks and studios, which over the years have included producer for the Primetime Emmy winning 'Prey' (20th Century/Hulu/Disney) '1883' (Paramount). The Wilds' (Amazon). 'Monsters of God (Plan B/TNT): 'Magnificent Severi (MGM/Columbia Pictures). 'Wind River' (Weinstein Co.). The Lone Ranger' (Disney/Jerry Bruckheimer Films); and 'Apocalypto' (Icon Ent/Jouchstone).



Eric Haywood Producer | Writer

A native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, **Eric** began his career directing and producing music videos featuring such artists as Usher, Cee-Lo Green, Outkast, New Edition, Ice-T, and Tupac Shakur. His video for E-40's song "Sprinkle Me" was selected by MTV and XXL Magazine as the #10 Greatest West Coast Rap Video of All Time.

Eric went on to write for such shows as ABC's Private Practice and Showtime's Soul Food: The Series. Along the way, he wrote and directed three short films (Nick of Time, Intersection, and Staring at the Sun), each of which screened at various film festivals around the country.

Eric also wrote the Hallmark Channel original movie Relative Stranger, starring Eriq LaSalle (E.R.) and directed by Charles Burnett (Killer of Sheep). The film garnered three NAACP Image Award nominations and a Best Supporting Actress Emmy nomination for Cicely Tyson.

Eric wrote and directed the independent feature film Four of Hearts before joining the writing staff of the hit Fox drama Empire. He co-wrote and directed an episode of Empire's fourth season, then directed the award-winning short film The Last Starship before going on to serve as a co-executive producer for Starz's Power, ABC's For Life, and NBC's Manifest and Law & Order: Organized Crime. He has developed projects for HBO, ABC, Fox, and Starz, and is currently developing the "Black Wall Street" historical drama Dreamland for Peacock and Universal Television.

Lawrence H. Levy is a highly regarded film and TV writer who is a Writers Guild Award winner and a two-time Emmy nominee. He has written for such hit TV shows as Family Ties, Saved by the Bell, Roseanne, and Seinfeld.



Michael Rowe Writer | Producer | Comedian

Mike, as a teenager, started as a stand up comic in New York City where he performed at such notable clubs as The Improv, The Comedy Cellar and Caroline's. From there he landed a job writing jokes for SNL's Weekend Update and sketches for shows on MTV, A&E and Comedy Central.

This soon brought him to Hollywood where he wrote on a comedy sketch show starring Martin Short. This led to his sitcom writing career where he wrote and produced shows for such stars as George Clooney, Ted Danson and with Eddie Murphy on his animated show, "The PJ's". This launched his animation career as a writer and producer on such series as "Family Guy" and "Futurama."

Along the way he was awarded 5 Emmy nominations (with 1 win), 2 Annine Awards (with 1 win) and a WGA Award for his Futurama episode, "Game of Tones." Mike was also co-executive producer on Comedy Central's animated series "Brickleberry" and a contributing writer on Danny McBride's animated series CHOZEN on FX. In 2013 he wrote and produced a documentary on The Improv comedy club. It starred many of the comics Mike started with like; Larry David, Ray Romano and Sarah Silverman.

Mike still finds time to write The Comedy Central Roasts every year and he's a contributor to Vanity Fair magazine.




